

Executive Team

In 2024, The Carpentries made progress toward a major organisational milestone: transitioning from fiscal sponsorship to independent non-profit status. This shift marked a new chapter in our journey, supported by strengthened governance, community-driven leadership, and continued delivery of impactful, inclusive training across the globe.

As of February 1, 2025, The Carpentries is officially operating as an independent 501(c)(3) organisation. In the year ahead, we are focused on expanding our capacity, deepening community engagement, and enhancing our infrastructure to support open science and data literacy initiatives with greater autonomy and sustainability.

Workshops and Instruction Team (WIT)

In 2024, the Workshops and Instruction Team began hosting online workshops available for anyone interested. During this experience, we were able to identify lesson learned that will help us to adjust our workflow.

In October 2024, we badged 22 new Instructor Trainers, the largest cohort ever to join the Instructor Trainer community.

In 2025, WIT will provide a feedback survey for the workshop hosts and Instructors to help WIT further develop the coordination of teaching workshops, and ensure that everyone has a meaningful experience.

We will also explore providing The Carpentries Instructor Training for those who only want to learn the teaching pedagogy. This may entail developing a curriculum and piloting at least one such event.

Community Engagement Team

In 2024, through the Catalyst Project (CP), we facilitated access to Cloud infrastructure, and our Instructor Training. CP also connected African and Latin American community members with programmes such as OLS Open Seed Cohort.

We expanded our multilingual dictionary, Glosario, by hosting Glosario CodeFests in 2024, to translate data science and programming terms.

In 2025, the Community Engagement Team will deepen its support for subcommunities, encouraging locally driven initiatives and updating the subcommunity registry to build stronger connections across The Carpentries' global network.

A supplemental proposal was submitted to the Andrew Mellon Foundation, and further funding was received to continue Glosario development and engagement with our global community in 2025.


Curriculum Team


In 2024, the Executive Council approved HPC (High Performance Computing) Carpentry for incubation as a new lesson program. Completion of the incubation process will enable Instructors to teach HPC Carpentry in official Carpentries workshops.

A redesigned version of Data Carpentry's *Data*Analysis and Visualisation in R for Ecologists, one of
The Carpentries most frequently taught lessons, was
released. Library Carpentry also added several
lessons, including introductions to Computational
Thinking and Data Management Plans for librarians.

In 2025, we will improve existing lessons by modernising software setup instructions and introducing content to address the use of generative AI tools during and after workshops.

With The Carpentries Incubator growing to include more than 200 repositories and the ongoing success of the Collaborative Lesson Development Training program, we will continue to facilitate the development and adoption of new lessons into the portfolio of Carpentries workshops.


In 2024, our income covered 85% of our expenses - up from 51% the previous year. We decreased expenses by 37% (largely through decreased staffing), while realising a modest increase (6%) in income. Our operating reliance (the portion of operating expenses covered by programmatic income) increased from 36% to 70%, representing a significant improvement in organisational financial health. Our Membership program continues to serve as our primary revenue source—contributing approximately two-thirds of our income each year.

Our largest expense continues to be team salaries and benefits, followed by fiscal sponsorship fees. With our launch as an independent 501(c)(3) in February 2025, we will no longer pay a percentage of our income in fiscal sponsorship fees.
